General Objective of the VII GAMIP Summit

1. Raise awareness of Peace and Human Rights issues, their practices, activities and associated social movements, both at the governmental level and at the social and academic level (in relation to youth, gender, ethnic groups, civil society needs, etc.).
2. To link the construction of a Culture of Peace with the conceptual and practical scope of Participatory Democracy, Citizenship and Defense of Human Rights.
3. Establish as a permanent component of the GAMIP Summits a GAMIP Film Forum - Media + Arts meeting - awarding a scholarship to a Youth representative who has made an impact in the field of Peace.
4. To prepare a Report on the conclusions of the Conference including a collective Declaration and proposals from the attendees, as well as a concrete agenda on the next steps to be taken.



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I - Previous events and activities related to the VII GAMIP 2022 SUMMIT

a) May 19, 2022 - COLOMBIA - Face-to-face activity in commemoration of the birth of José Martí. Conference: Martí: Educator of Freedom (UPTC - Tunja, Colombia). Professor ALICIA CABEZUDO

Narrative/qualitative report: The activity was held at the Universidad Santo Tomás de Tunja, Boyacá - Colombia in the framework of the celebration of the birth of the Cuban patriot and educator José Martí. The event was attended by students from Universidad Santo Tomas and Universidad Pedagógica y Tecnológica de Colombia - UPTC - as well as professors and authorities from both universities.

The values related to Peace Education developed by this Cuban hero were highlighted, as well as their link with those presented by GAMIP in the Latin American region, particularly those related to solidarity and continental cooperation.

Quantitative report: Attended by: 150 people Students and Teachers

Ambassador and Diplomatic Corps of Cuba in the Republic of Colombia.

b) June 10 - July 2, 2022 - LATIONAMERICAN REGION - GAMIP Latin America & Caribbean Virtual Course in partnership with Asociación Respuesta para la Paz (Argentina). Seminar: Mediation Tools for Everyday Conflicts. Professor DIANA DE LA RUA EUGENIO

Narrative/qualitative report: Theoretical and practical course was held to acquire tools, skills and training to address the conflicts that arise in communities and to manage them in a non-violent manner, aimed at professionals from different specialties, education workers, social workers, managers or workers in organizations and independent persons who wish to discourage the escalation of violence and build more harmonious communities. It is a training in which student participation is promoted and cases of students and the chair are worked on. Certification was granted by both institutions to those who fulfilled the requirements of attendance and presentation of the final paper.



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Quantitative report: 20 people from the following countries registered: Argentina 4, Chile 1, Colombia 4, Ecuador 3, France 1, Mexico 4, Nicaragua 1, Uruguay 1, Venezuela 1. At the end of the course, certificates were issued to those who completed all the assignments. Diana de la Rúa Eugenio of Asociación Respuesta para la Paz was in charge of the training. The course consisted of 30 hours total, in 8 online classes of 3 hours each (24 synchronous hours) + 6 hours of autonomous work.

c) June - July 2022 - Virtual Course - LATIN AMERICAN REGION - GAMIP Latin America and the Caribbean in alliance with JUNPAZ (Mexico). Seminar: Pedagogy for the Construction of a Culture of Peace, Citizenship and Defense of Human Rights. Professor ALICIA CABEZUDO

Narrative/qualitative report:

The course aimed to develop theoretical models, pedagogical tools and new knowledge for the attendees in the field of a progressive didactics passable to be applied at the formal and non-formal level in different educational spaces. Likewise, professional experiences, bibliography and articles related to the topics were exchanged, prevailing a creative and supportive dialogue among participants who built a very suitable atmosphere for collaborative and transformative learning throughout the course. Some of them have been actively linked to GAMIP ALC and its regional activities after the Course.

20 students from three countries: Mexico, Colombia and Argentina.

d) June - August 2022 - Virtual Course - LATIN AMERICAN REGION - GAMIP ALC in partnership with Casa de la Pax Cultura (Argentina), Fundación Latinoamericana Objetivo 16 and Intermed Salta (Argentina). Postgraduate Course: Restorative Skills for the Construction of a Culture of Peace. 2nd Edition.

Narrative/qualitative report: The postgraduate course on Restorative Skills for the Construction of a Culture of Peace was held. 2nd Edition. Taught by Dr. Marta Nydia Paillet (Intermed Salta - Esp en Mediación Educativa - Gamip Latin America and the Caribbean, Casa de la Pax Cultura) and Maria Elonora Áviles Tulián (Fundación Latinoamericana Objetivo 16 and Gamip Latin America and the



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Caribbean) Defensoría del Pueblo de la Provincia de Santafe - Argentina, with the support of Tutor Teachers. Marked in Res.Min#1851/08. With the objective of knowing communicational skills and restorative devices in the different areas of human development.

Quantitative report:

45 students attended and were certified.

e) July 28, 2022 - MEXICO - Coffee for PEACE. In Merida, Mexico. Ethics Sustainable Market Store. Moderator: Professor MARCELA MONTERO (member of Gamip ALC - Mexico).

Narrative/quantitative report: The activity was organized by a student of the International Diploma in Pedagogy for the Construction of a Culture of Peace, Citizenship and Defense of Human Rights. Ma. Lourdes Silveira. The store functions as a collaborative space where diverse people with a consciousness of fair economy and sustainability participate. We were invited to talk about these issues and the culture of peace. Ten people arrived and among them a boy about 9 years old started to ask questions about the theme and to comment on violence in his school. As the topic of sustainability would be discussed, people interested in these topics attended and two of them work in orchards and botanical gardens.

f) August - December 2022 - LATIN AMERICAN REGION - GAMIP ALC in academic agreement with Universidad Modelo (Mexico) and Centro de Derechos Humanos de la Universidad de la Serena (Chile) Virtual Diploma: Pedagogy for the Construction of a Culture of Peace, Citizenship and Defense of Human Rights. General Coordinator. Professor MARCELA MONTERO (member of GAMIP Mexico).

Qualitative and quantitative report: The second cohort of the International Diploma in Education in Cultures of Peace, Citizenship and Human Rights, began on August 6 and ended on December 10, 2022. With the participation of 11 people from Mexico, Argentina and Bolivia. Eight people completed the program.

The program consists of 5 modules with a total of 120 hours. It was conducted online, on Tuesdays, Fridays and Saturdays, 10 hours per week, 20 hours per module.



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The coordinating group is made up of Alicia Cabezudo from Gamip ALC; Edgardo Carabantes from Universidad de la Serena, La Serena, Chile and Marcela Montero from Universidad Modelo, Yucatan, Mexico.

XIII Latin American Meeting of Librarians, Archivists and Museologists. Medellin, University of Antioquia. Conference: Libraries, Archives and Museums for Peace Building. Contributions from the Truth Commission and the 2022 Report. Professor ALICIA CABEZUDO

Narrative/qualitative report: The conference was held in a face-to-face - virtual format with outreach throughout Latin America, from the University of Antioquia, Medellin - Colombia. The presence and integration of a large number of librarians from several Latin American countries as audience of this Meeting and the Conference was very interesting, since it was the first time that they approached the subject of Peace and the possibilities of working in this field in their work spaces and in the Museums of the continent.

Great interest was aroused and they continue in a very active link with GAMIP ALC, hoping to carry out joint activities during the next year 2023

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Narrative/qualitative report: The conference takes place at the University of Tolima, Ibagué - Colombia with the attendance of students and professors of all the careers of the mentioned University. The impact of the Truth Commission Report on the Colombian population and its link with Education for the Culture of Peace and Reconciliation is developed as a central theme.

Narrative/qualitative report: The activity was organized by the Faculty of Juridical Sciences and International Politics of the Juan de Castellanos University Foundation in alliance with the Schools of Peace Foundation with the objective of reflecting on the role of youth in the construction of peace, based on the approach to the Truth Commission Report and its leading role in the democratic scenario. Young university students from Universidad Juan de Castellanos and Universidad Pedagógica y Tecnológica de Colombia - UPTC participated. Tunja. As a methodology, a central conference with binding themes, working tables and final plenary were carried out.

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Narrative/qualitative report: A dynamic and interesting meeting Coffee for Peace was held at the Faculty of Health and Medical Sciences of the UPTC of Tunja with the coordination of Professor Dr. Zulma Mongui, attended by students from the Faculty of Medicine and Psychology.

Dr. Luis Bernardo Díaz Gamboa also attended as a guest to introduce the topic of Peace to students who had never before participated in this type of meetings and topics.

The Director of the Psychology Career of the UPTC and the Secretary of the Dean of the Faculty of Law of the UPTC attended. Those present showed great interest in participating, collaborating with GAMIP and being present at the Summit that would begin a few days later.

They also volunteer to accompany the foreigners present at the future Summit and to collaborate with them in their daily lives.

There is an intense open dialogue, questions and active participation of all those present, with Professor Gustavo Zuluaga coordinating activities and facilitating the exchange.

The outcome of the meeting stimulates those present to continue linking and meeting during the Summit week at the UPTC campus, which indeed happened.

ACTIVITY REPORT

The mission of the I AM PEACE Short Film Forum (IAPSFF) is to highlight the impact of Cinematic Media Arts through critical activism, youth voice, innovative solutions and creative social partnerships that will influence a thriving CULTURE OF PEACE mindset and a change of heart consciousness in everyday life.

(IAP SFF) was created as a concurrent collaborative event scheduled as an extension of the 2022 program of the 7th GAMIP Summit "Peace in Action" and would be presented online this September 27 + 3 to October 7, 2022 and onsite at the Universidad Pedagógica y Tecnológica (UPTC) Colombia, South America. With



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over 24 hours of online screenings, including the eclectic Fireside Chat Review after each thematic session, the screenings were moderated in person by Gil Agnew and Georgina Galanis, founding director, and included reviewers and various global peace influencers pre-recorded for introspective discussions. The event was well attended online and scheduled in person at the conference. Each of the official VIPeace film screenings are listed on our website and cover the topics:

Due to UPTC transmission problems, the breakfast meetings were not successfully implemented on site. SYNTHESIS.

The papers presented were very interdisciplinary in nature.

The link with the thematic axis of human rights and various associated topics predominated: collaborative economy; violence and citizen security; public transportation and energy service; peace as a constitutive "umbrella" of human rights; the communal rights of civil society organizations; animal rights.

Between the first group of four presentations and the second group of nine, it can be recognized that different dimensions were covered in relation to the human rights approach, not necessarily all connected to each other. Some papers could be grouped according to approaches that emphasized the doctrine and theory of human rights. Other papers focused on the analysis and characterization of public policies deployed in our countries, with their strengths and weaknesses in guaranteeing denunciation, protection and monitoring. And finally, proposals that appealed to the socio-community work, where the struggle to claim certain rights is crossed by inequalities of all kinds, product of socio-structural relations that impact on the violation of citizens.
